

- Incident : On 12-23-24 the family of Pemberton called 911 with concerns in reference to Pemberton.
  Pemberton is anti-government and anti-establishment. Pemberton planned to commit a terrorist attack in Plantation, FL. Ofc. Tirado initiated the report, Sgt. Blizzard and Det. Torres, worked with state and federal agencies to get Pemberton into custody.


