



PROJECT UNDERSTANDING

The Eastside RTS Bus Transfer Station is proposed to sit on Lot 3 of the EHEDI Master Plan which was crafted by CHW (a member of this team) in collaboration with the City, UF Health and Alachua County, and includes a UF Clinic, UF Dental, Grocery Store, RTS Facility, Fire Station, retail and apartments.



This project includes the design and new construction of a modern 16,000sqft City Hall for the City of Newberry. Monarch facilitated extensive collaboration with various subconsultants, user groups and stakeholders, such as City Commissioners, City Staff, FDOT, and the public, throughout the design process. Monarch has partnered with the Florida Department of Military Affairs (DMA) for many years. The continuing contract covers many projects that involve many components found in this project including coordination with FDOT. Monarch's most recent project on the DMA contract was a historic renovation of the legendary Cooper Hall on Camp Blanding. Originally built in 1941 as an Officer's Club, this cultural affairs project included a contributing "historic" structure on the base that was never listed on the national register of historic places, causing the project to required strict SHIPO processes.. The general goals included updating the utilitarian functions such as restrooms, MEP systems, correcting existing issues, removing non-conforming features, and repairing items in disrepair-- all while maintaining the "historic" 1940s style and features. DMA hired Monarch while funding was incomplete, so our team also navigated the complexities of renovation, while we coordinated the project through the funding process and COVID.
