WHEREAS, during National Cybersecurity Awareness Month, we acknowledge the danger that cyber threats pose to our economy and public infrastructure and raise awareness about steps we can take to mitigate and prevent future attacks; and

WHEREAS, Cybersecurity threats have increased globally as well as in government agencies throughout the United States; and

WHEREAS, the City of Gainesville has aligned with the national theme of "See yourself in cyber" with our slogan "See something wrong - Do something right. Think before you click"; and

WHEREAS, the City of Gainesville has prepared a month-long agenda to encourage staff participation in keeping the city's systems and information safe through education and reinforcement of good security practices; and

WHEREAS, the City of Gainesville has adopted mandatory cybersecurity awareness training in advance of the State of Florida requirements introduced in HB 7055.
