

## Meeting Overview – Request: City Initiated

The City of Gainesville's Department of Sustainable Development is hosting this neighborhood workshop to discuss proposed land use and zoning changes. The proposal will amend the City of Gainesville Future Land Use Map from Mixed-Use Office/Residential (MOR) to Urban Mixed Use (UMU). Zoning from Urban 3 (U3), Urban 4 (U4), Urban 6 (U6) to Urban 8 (U8).

# Background:

The City Commission has directed the Department of Sustainable Development to begin the process to initiate the appropriate land use/zoning change for the subject property that would accommodate the proposed uses. The proposed Land Use to Urban Mixed Use (UMU) and the Southern portion of the property would be Public Services and Operations (PS), and the zoning would be Urban 8 (U8).

- **Zoning laws** are the laws that regulate the use of land
- **Land use plan** means the future land use element of the most recent city Comprehensive Plan
- **Public services** are services offered or controlled by a government



It is the logical action resulting to change the land use, and zoning which would allow the use for East Gainesville clinic, RTS mobility hub/transfer station, community resource paramedicine

# The Proposal

The future land use designation of approximately 21.69 acres and Zoning 23.14 to facilitate the development of the 10, 000 square foot urgent care center facility. The purpose is to produce the land uses that would enable implementation of corresponding zoning designations essential to facilitating redevelopment of the subject parcels.







\*These numbers reflect 6-month time window pre/post program enrollment, thus only patients having graduated from CRP for six months were analyzed in this dataset.

### Measures:


We will measure success of the CRP individualized care programs through the lenses of successful resource pairing, improvements in the patients' quality of life scores, decrease in unnecessary utilization of the EMS system. Success of the CRP program also can be measured by tracking a reduction in missed primary care provider (PCP) appointments, and hospital admissions. Community Health impact is measured through participation rates.


