POLICY RESEARCH PROCESS

Phase 1: Research & Idea Formulation Commission and/or
Commissioner determines
problem to be solved and
where it aligns with the
strategic plan.

Policy staff may utilize Strategic Initiatives to help determine best match to strategic plan.

Policy Staff research and refine ideas for GPC discussion.

Phase 2: GPC Consideration Commissioner presents research, idea, and alignment to the strategic plan for discussion at GPC.

Item further refined by GPC.

If GPC wishes to proceed,

item assigned to appropriate

ADVISORY BOARDS

Broward County

- Small Business Advisory Board in 2001
- Each County Commissioner appoints 1 member each, Board appoints 2 at-large members

City of Sunrise

- Small Business Advisory Board
- Advises Director of Economic Development
- 7 members, appointed by City Commission

PREVIOUS POLICY RESEARCH REPORTS RELATED TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

- Empty Storefront Activation and Temporary Art Installations
 - Can improve the appearance of empty storefronts, provide economic opportunities for artists, and attract tenants to the location.
 - May include **2D, 3D or pop-up installations**/studio space for artists. Programs are frequently done in collaboration with non-profit organizations, local artists, and local businesses.
 - San Francisco, CA; Arlington, MA
- Economic Development Corporations
 - Private, non-profit organizations dedicated to job creation within a municipality that can serve as an alternative for economic development being the responsibility of a public agency.
 - Finances improvement programs, provides loans, and encourages development
 - Lakeland, FL; Plant City, FL; Montgomery County, MD

POTENTIAL DISADVANTAGES TO POLICIES

Disadvantage

Engaging in these efforts would take **dedicated effort** by **city staff** and budget allocations are locked in for FY23.

Disadvantage

Integration of new programs may increase staff demand and may require establishment of new roles.

Disadvantage

Additional incentives on business development may not be sufficient to increase economic development within the City and may be better facilitated by community partners.

POTENTIAL ADVANTAGES TO POLICIES

Advantage

Business and Resource

Guides may encourage the
creation of more businesses
by reducing knowledge and
financial barriers

Advantage

Appointments with staff/liaison can improve accessibility to resources as it centralizes where to find programs and incentives.

Advantage

Advisory Boards can **increase communication** between government and the business community and provide advice on beneficial policies.

POLICY RESEARCH PROCESS

Phase 3: Timeline Development Lead Charter convenes cross departmental working group.*

Charter Officer determines time/resources required to evaluate proposal and creates community engagement plan.

Lead Charter submits timeline as outlined by working group.

Phase 4:

Full Staff Analysis and Proposal Development Lead Charter continues to convene working group.*

Charter officer and staff assess GPC directive for impacts (operational, fiscal, etc.) and requirements.

Office of Equity & Inclusion conducts an Equity Analysis.

Management conducts an Operational Risk Assessment.

The City Attorney conducts Legal Review.

Phase 5: Proposal Returns to GPC Policy Staff Coordinates final presentation to ensure the idea has been passed to each Charter.

Charter staff presents final operation recommendations and community engagement to full Commission at GPC.

City Commission decides whether to augment, implement, table, or archive the proposal.

Phase 6: Implementation Policy implemented and metrics gathered for KPIs.
