




PRCA Master Plan Update

- July 1, 2022 PRCA hires Barth Associates, LLC to create a PRCA community needs and priorities assessment
 - Summer, 2022 One-on-one interviews, focus group meetings, meetings with individual City Commissioners
- October, 2022 Round 1 of community needs and priorities assessment meetings take place
- Fall, 2022 Community-wide statistically valid survey (by district) sent out
- Fall/Spring 22/23 Online survey
- January, 2023 Round 2 of community needs and priorities assessment meetings take place
- Spring, 2023 Finalize PRCA community needs and priorities assessment / Update PRCA's Master Plan and Wild Spaces & Public Places project priorities
- Summer, 2023 Discussion with the General Policy Committee on future Wild Spaces & Public Places project priorities

Wild Spaces & Public Places - 2023 through 2032!



- \$3M County Partnership Funding Dedicated to the City of Gainesville. Proposed projects:
- Thelma A. Boltin Center, \$1,500,000
- Citizens Field, \$1,000,000
- Sweetwater Wetlands Park, \$500,000
- \$3M County Partnership Funding Divided between the 9 municipalities (\$660,000 allocated during last round of WSPP). Proposed Projects:
- NE 31st Avenue Trail (NE 15th Street to NE Waldo Road), \$330,000
- SE 15th Street Trail (Boulware Springs Park to SE 8th Avenue), \$330,000

Projects the WSPP Sales Tax can fund

212.055, Florida Statutes ("State Criteria")

Expenditures "associated with the construction, reconstruction, or improvement of public facilities that have a life expectancy of 5 or more years, any related land acquisition, land improvement, design, and engineering costs, and all other professional and related costs required to bring the public facilities into service."

Ballot Referendum Language ("Local Criteria")

"ACQUIRE AND IMPROVE LANDS FOR CONSERVATION, WILDLIFE HABITAT, WATER QUALITY, AND RECREATION; OPERATE AND MAINTAIN PARKS AND RECREATION FACILITIES;" Questions?
