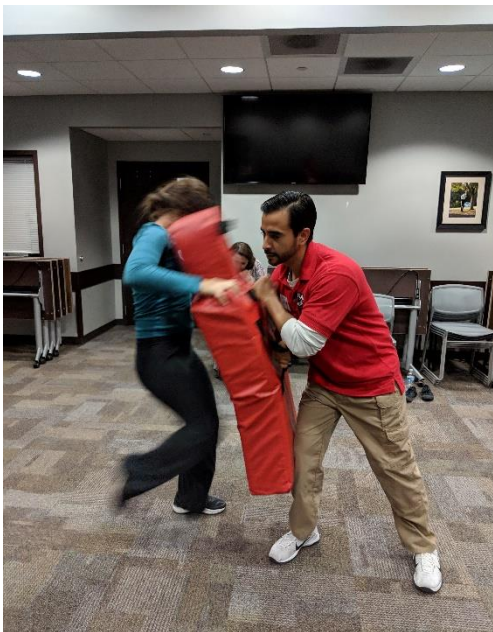

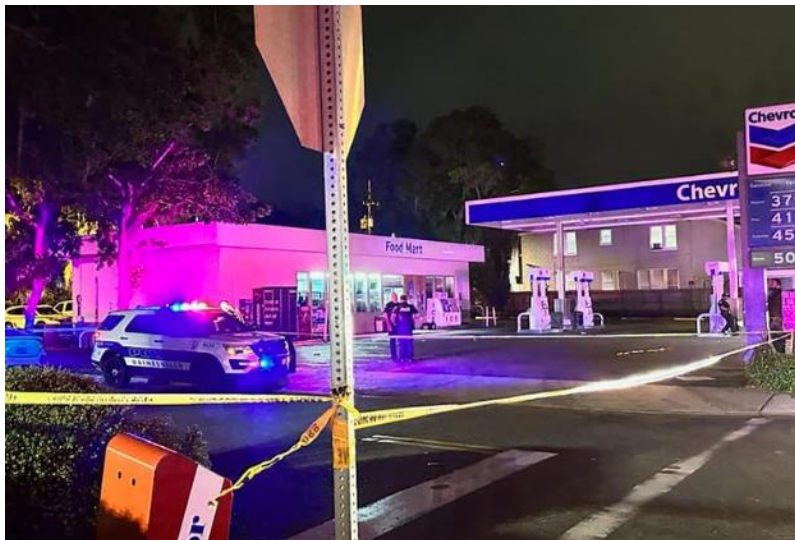

## Double Homicide/Attempt Homicide

- 229 NW 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue
- Offender Arrested - Dallvion Parker, B/M, 3-15-1994
- Parker fled the area but was arrested when he returned to Gainesville.

## Homicide

- 3120 SW 26<sup>th</sup> Terrace, #A
- Offender Arrested – Elijah Moore, B/M, 10-02-2006
- Moore was involved in a disturbance with the victim. He was located and arrested at Aloha Liquors.

## Aggravated Child Abuse/Neglect

- 1600 SW Archer Road
- Offender Arrested – Justin Shavers, B/M, 2/7/03
- The 18 month old baby was left in the care of Shavers who violently bit, burned, and struck the baby over a period of days.

## Lewd and Lascivious Molestation

- Offender Sentenced to Natural Life in Prison – Donald Bryan McKee, W/M, 5-18-55
- McKee is a registered sexual predator. McKee was found guilty of molesting a 6 year old child in March.

# Criminal Investigations Division Special Investigations Division



## January:

Interdiction officer(s) conducted a traffic stop on two men from Detroit, MI. who stated they were enroute to Walmart in Gainesville. During a probable cause search, a bag containing fraudulent driver's licenses from other states and a fraudulent credit card were located. This bag was concealed under the gear shift/cup holder area of the vehicle (see pictures below). Driver was arrested and Investigation on going.

Result: 9 Fraudulent DL's and 1 Fraudulent CC

## February:

Interdiction officer(s) conducted a traffic stop on two subjects out of Arizona. A consent search revealed a loaded handgun, inside a shoulder bag, on the passenger. Further search revealed a second handgun, on the passenger floorboard, that was stolen in 2016 out of Nevada. Once subjects were detained, the driver (who is a three time convicted felon) was found to have a loaded, un-holstered handgun in his waistband. Both subjects were arrested on the weapons charges. Once at the jail, one subject had a small amount of fentanyl inside his underwear. Additional charges were filed.

Result: 3 handguns (1 stolen), 9 magazines, and 339 rounds of ammunition



# Criminal Investigations Division Special Investigations Division



## March:

Interdiction officers conducted a traffic stop in which the below drugs were located. The Defendant was from Ohio where he claimed he was visiting Florida for vacation.

The vehicle was observed utilizing the emergency turn around lane on I-75. The vehicle was stopped and a road side interview ensued. Through that interview probable cause was established for a search. During that search the interdiction officers located 19.2 lbs. of marijuana in the rear cargo area of the vehicle. Subjects were transported to ASO where they are cooperating with detectives.

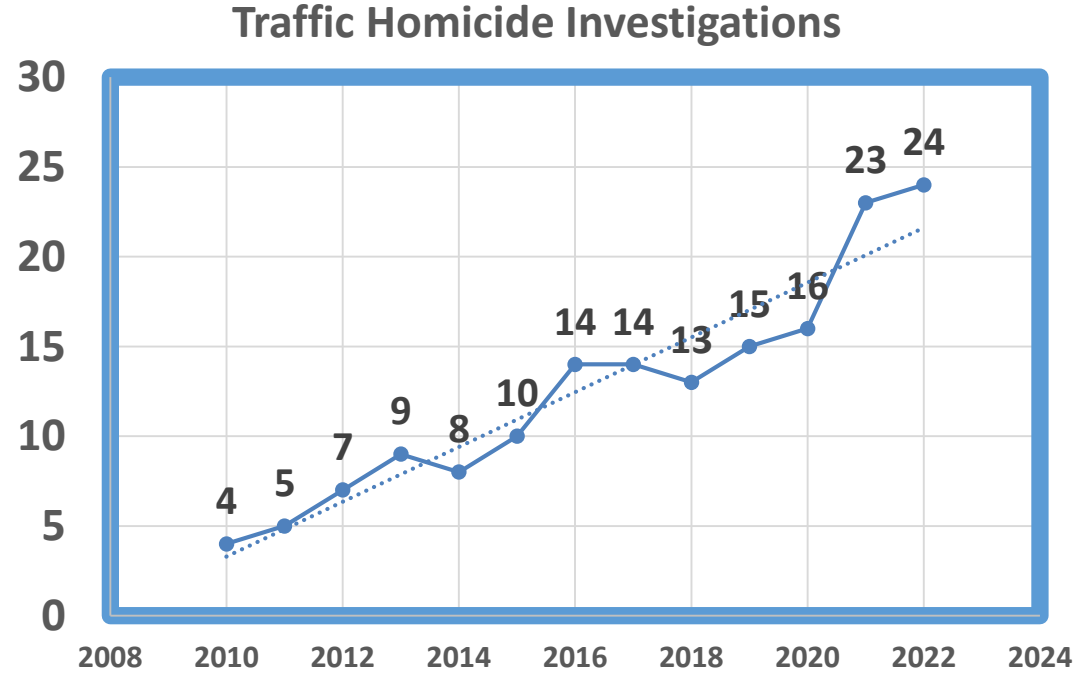
Result: 109.59 grams Edibles, 1 gram THC oil pen, 2.15 grams Cocaine, 34.07 grams Marijuana

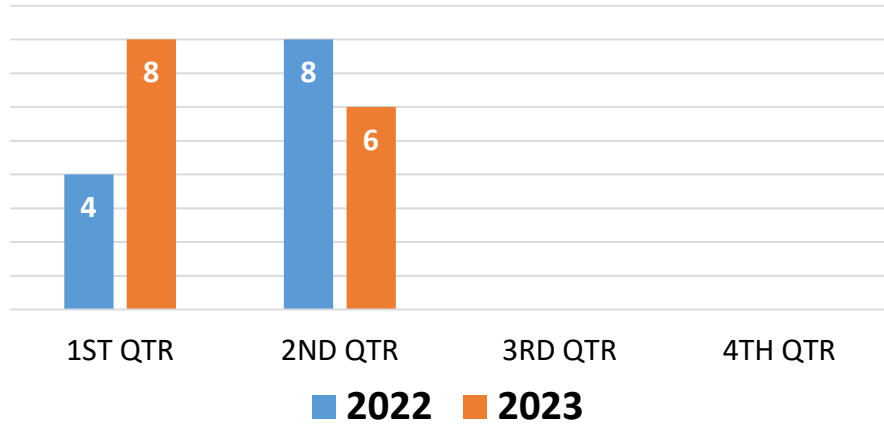
Traffic Homicide Investigations “THI” (Actual Loss of Life)



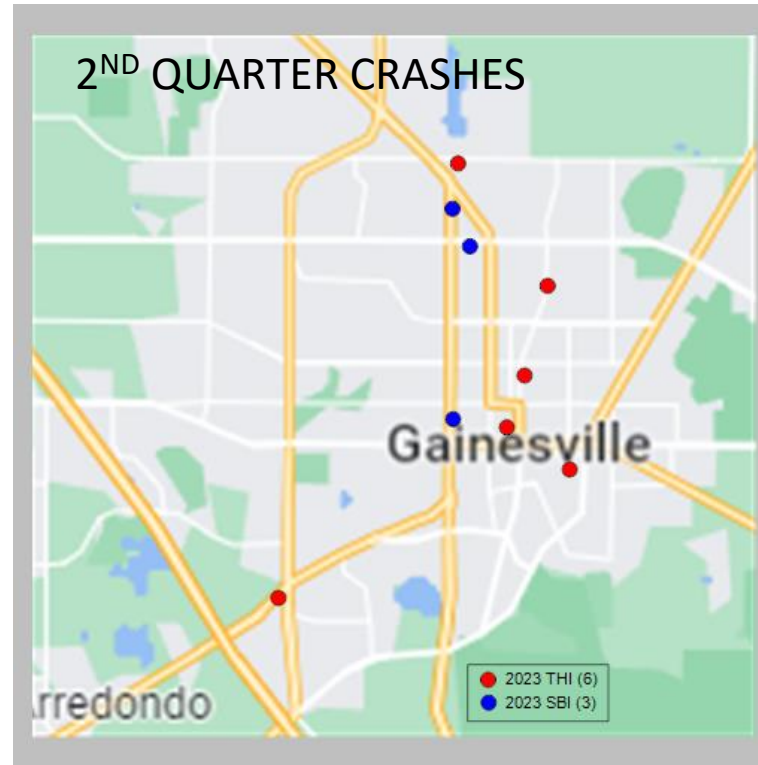
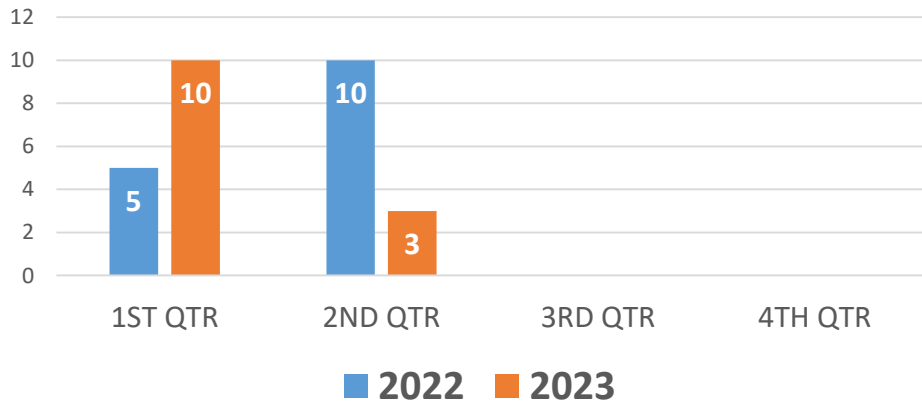
# 2023 Major Traffic Crashes 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter (FY 2023)

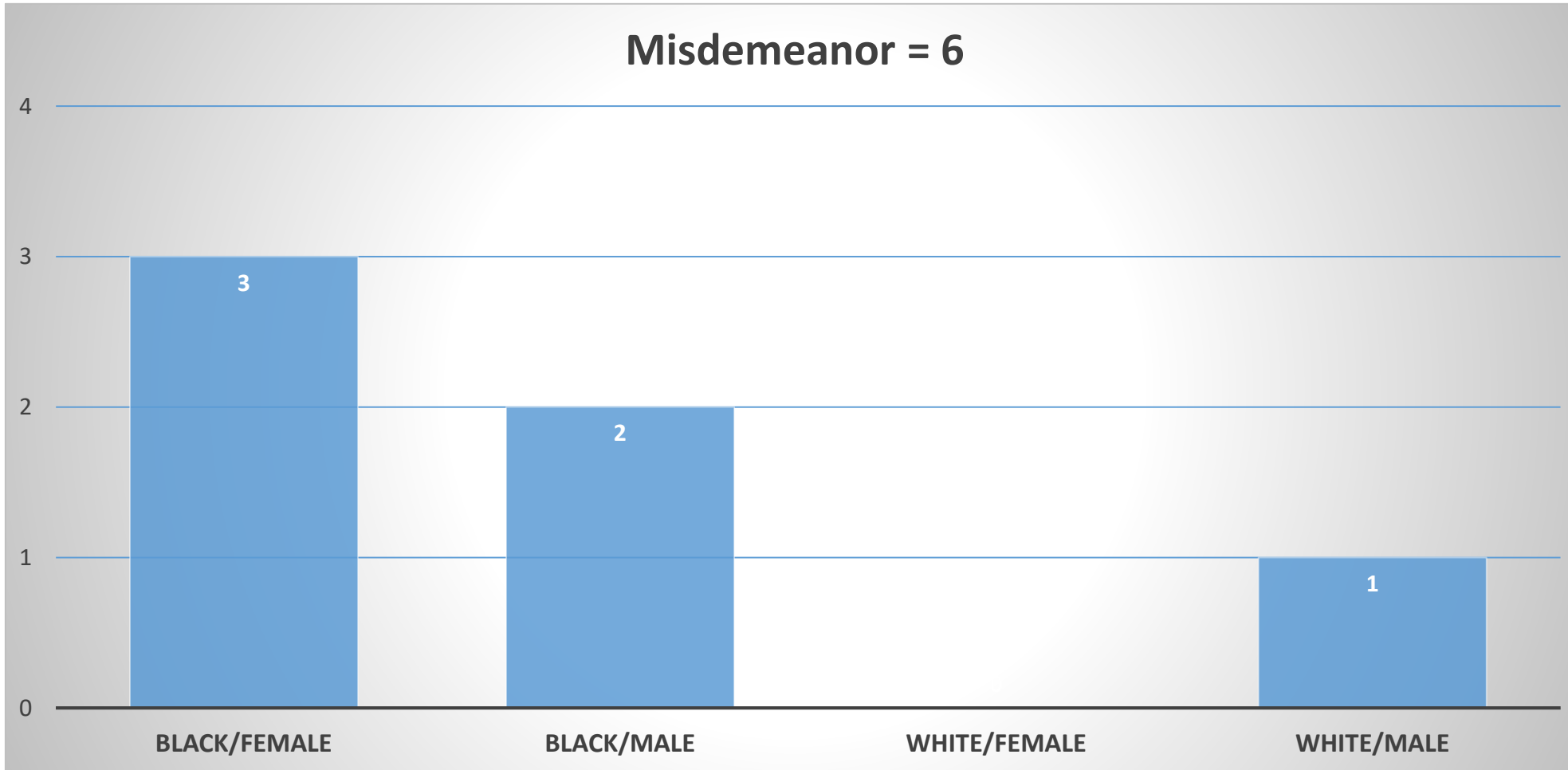
