

## **ORDINANCE NO. 2023-855**

2 3 4 5 6 7 8	An ordinance of the City of Gainesville, Florida, adding regulations for an Entertainment District related to open containers of alcoholic beverages and including a map for a Downtown Entertainment District by adding a new Article IV within Chapter 4 of the Code of Ordinances; providing directions to the codifier; providing a severability clause; providing a repealing clause; and providing an effective date.
9	WHEREAS, the City of Gainesville, Florida ("City") is a duly constituted municipality having such
LO	power and authority conferred upon it by the Florida Constitution and the Municipal Home Rule
l1	Powers Act; and
L2	WHEREAS, the Municipal Home Rule Powers Act, Chapter 166, Florida Statutes, secures for
L3	municipalities the broad exercise of home rule powers granted by Article VIII, Section 2 of the
L4	Florida Constitution, including the exercise of any power for municipal purposes not expressly
L5	prohibited by law; and
L6	WHEREAS, at least ten days' notice has been given once by publication in a newspaper of general
L7	circulation notifying the public of this proposed ordinance and of public hearings to be held by
L8	the City Commission of the City of Gainesville; and
L9	WHEREAS, the public hearings were held pursuant to the published notice described at which
20	hearings the parties in interest and all others had an opportunity to be and were, in fact heard;

22	WHEREAS, the City Commission has determined that the changes to the Code of Ordinances as
23	provided in this ordinance serve a valid public purpose and are in the best interest of the public

Sec. 4-59. – Definitions.

49 As used in this article, the following words and phrases have the meanings indicated.

Alcoholic beverage(s) means those alcoholic beverages as defined in Chapters 561, 563, and 564, Florida Statutes, and as interpreted by the courts of this state and the state director of the division of alcoholic beverages and tobacco of the department of business and professional regulation, and includes beer, wine, and liquor, or any beverage containing any of the foregoing.

- 55 Alcoholic beverage establishment means an alcoholic beverage dispensing establishment
- located within the entertainment district(s) and which is licensed and permitted under state
- 57 law to sell alcoholic beverages.
- 58 **Approved container** means an aluminum, plastic, or paper cup provided by an alcoholic
- 59 <u>beverage establishment and intended for removal of an alcoholic beverage from the licensed</u>
- 60 premises. Approved containers may not exceed 16 fluid ounces in size and may not consist of
- cans, bottles, or glass containers.
- 62 Entertainment district(s) means the distinct area(s) within the boundaries of the
- entertainment district(s) as set forth in section 4-58.
- 64 **Open container** means as that term is defined in Section 4-1 of the Code of Ordinances.
- 65 **Outside** means all sidewalks, streets, alleyways, and designated street crossing paths that are
- 66 <u>within the boundaries of the entertainment district(s) and beyond the premises of a licensed</u>
- alcoholic beverage establishment.
- Sec. 4-60. Outside consumption of alcoholic beverages.
- Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary within the Code of Ordinances, persons of
- 70 legal age to purchase and consume alcoholic beverages may, within the boundaries of the
- 71 entertainment district(s), possess and consume an open container of an alcoholic beverage
- 72 outside of the premises of alcoholic beverage establishments, subject to the following
- 73 <u>regulations:</u>

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- a. Hours. Alcoholic beverage establishments may dispense an open container of an alcoholic beverage for removal from the licensed premises of the alcoholic beverage establishment, and a person may possess and consume an open container of an alcoholic beverage outside of the licensed premises of an alcoholic beverage establishment, only within the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 11:30 p.m. Extended hours of consumption for special events may be granted pursuant to applicable sections of the Code of Ordinances.
- <u>b.</u> <u>Approved container.</u> Open containers of alcoholic beverages dispensed, possessed, or consumed within the entertainment district(s) pursuant to this article must be in an approved container.
- c. <u>Drink limit</u>. Alcoholic beverage establishments shall not allow a person to exit its premises with more than one (1) open container of an alcoholic beverage, and no person may exit the premises of an alcoholic beverage establishment with more than one (1) open container of an alcoholic beverage.
- d. <u>Entering an alcoholic beverage establishment</u>. No person may enter an alcoholic beverage establishment with an open container of an alcoholic beverage, whether acquired at that alcoholic beverage establishment or elsewhere.
- 91 <u>e. Notice of boundaries.</u> Alcoholic beverage establishments shall post, at all points of egress from the licensed premises, a map of the boundaries of the entertainment

- 93 <u>district in which it is located. Alcoholic beverage establishments shall also provide,</u>
  94 <u>either in electronic or paper form, a map of the entertainment district upon request.</u>
  - f. Enforcement. Any person or alcoholic beverage establishment not in compliance with any provision of this article will be subject to the penalties designated in sections 1-9 or 2-339 of the Code of Ordinances. Each violation will be considered a separate offense, which can be prosecuted separately.

- **SECTION 2.** Section 2-339 of the Code of Ordinances is amended as follows. Except as amended herein, the remainder of Section 2-339 remains in full force and effect.

**SECTION 3.** It is the intent of the City Commission that the provisions of Sections 1 and 2 of this ordinance become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Gainesville, Florida, and that the sections and paragraphs of the Code of Ordinances may be renumbered or relettered in order to accomplish such intent.

**SECTION 4.** If any word, phrase, clause, paragraph, section, or provision of this ordinance or the application hereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid or unconstitutional, such finding will not affect the other provisions or applications of this ordinance that can be given effect without the invalid or unconstitutional provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are declared severable.

**SECTION 5.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are to the extent of such conflict hereby repealed.
