A Resolution of the City of Gainesville, Florida, authorizing the City Manager or designee to apply for and enter into Traffic Operations related Grants.

WHEREAS, the City of Gainesville operates and maintains a Traffic Operations Infrastructure, consisting of Traffic Signals, Traffic Management Systems, and Traffic Technology for the Florida Department of Transportation, Alachua County, the University of Florida and six (6) partner municipalities of Alachua, Archer, Hawthorne, High Springs, Micanopy, Newberry and Waldo; and,

**WHEREAS**, the City of Gainesville City Commission recognizes the importance of traffic and transportation safety, efficiency, reliability and security; and,

**WHEREAS**, the City of Gainesville has been an active participant in Nationwide and Statewide related Traffic Operations, Grants, Innovation and Research; and

WHEREAS, the City of Gainesville will seek grants for projects that are concurrent and consistent with the existing Strategic Plan, Capital Improvement Plan, and/or would offset ongoing Traffic Signal System Operational and Maintenance needs.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:

Section 1. The City Manager or designee is authorized to apply for grants with the United States Department of Transportation, the Florida Department of Transportation, the Department of Homeland Security, the Florida Department of Management Services, the University of Florida, the National Science Foundation or the Transportation Research Board related Traffic Operation projects and initiatives consistent with the City's existing Strategic Plan, Capital Improvement Plan, and/or would offset ongoing Traffic Signal System Operational and Maintenance needs; and

Section 2. The City Manager or designee is authorized to execute grant agreements and any other necessary documents grants with the United States Department of Transportation, the Florida Department of Transportation, the Department of Homeland Security, the Florida Department of Management Services, the University of Florida, the National Science Foundation or the Transportation Research Board, subject to approval by the City Attorney or designee as to form and legality.

Section 3. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption.
