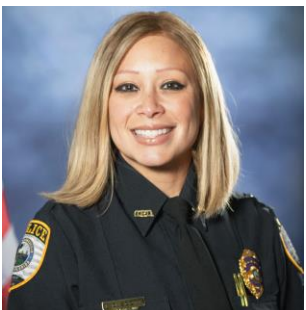

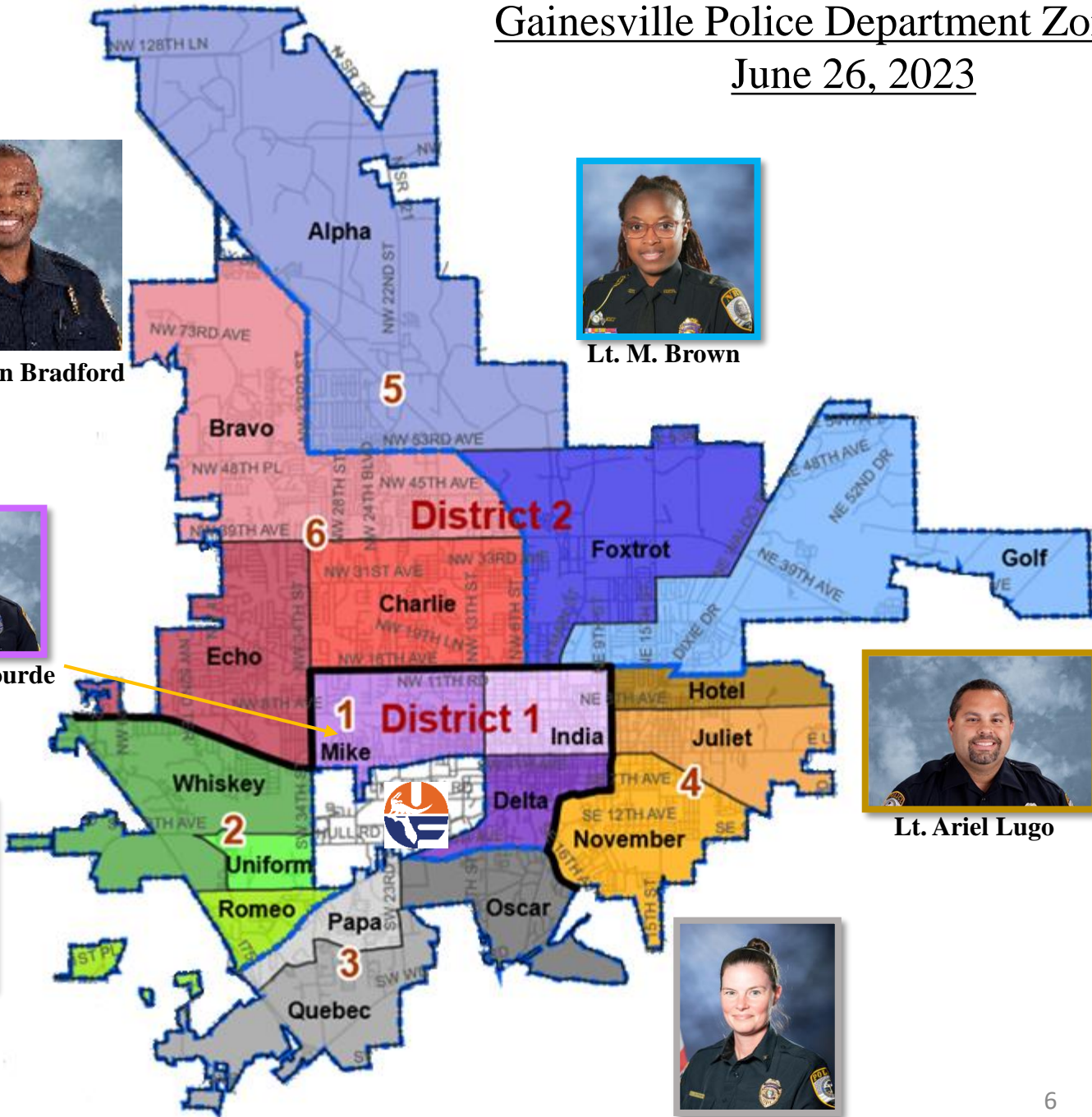

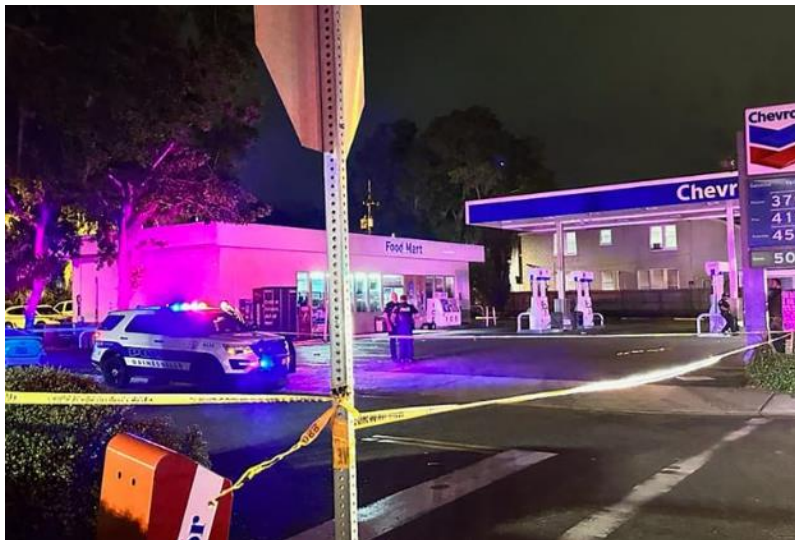


## Downtown Post Concert Event

- 54 traffic stops, 46 warnings, issued 8 citations and 6 arrests.

## Downtown Violent Crime Detail

- 25 traffic stops, 20 warnings, issued 6 citations and 1 arrests
- **Narcotics Seized** included a trafficking amount of MDMA and two arrests for sale and possession of cannabis.
- **Firearms Seized: 2**



# Criminal Investigations Division

## Robbery/Homicide Investigations

### Attempted Homicide/Drug Related Robbery

- May 9, 2023
- 1516 SE 4<sup>th</sup> Street
- Offender Arrested – Zakee Koon, B/M, 4/22/84
- Koon was involved in a drug deal that turned into a robbery. Koon shot the victim in retaliation for the robbery. Victim sustained life threatening injuries.

CID Robbery/Homicide Squad: **5** Detectives (1 Sergeant, 1 Corporal, 3 Detectives)

Case Load: **21-56** cases each

### Attempted Homicide

- May 13, 2023
- 4155 NW 13<sup>th</sup> St
- Offender Arrested – Henry Pope, B/M, 9/17/59
- Pope shot the victim during a disturbance. Victim sustained life threatening injuries.



# Criminal Investigations Division

## Property and Financial Investigations

### Grand Theft Auto/Conveyance Burglaries

- May 18 2023 – June 6 2023
- Multiple complexes in NE and SE Gainesville
- 5 Juvenile Offenders Arrested
- All arrested on one singular case with pending charges for the remaining 21 outstanding cases. 22 separate cases involving either stolen Kias or Kias being burglarized in an attempt to steal the vehicle.
- Offenders smashed windows to gain entry to all vehicles. Vehicles were located throughout the city with extensive damage. One offender with previous history of grand theft auto, robbery, burglary. Other offenders with minor or no history.

## Domestic Highway Enforcement Task Force (DHETF) DISMANTLES FRAUD ORGANIZATION

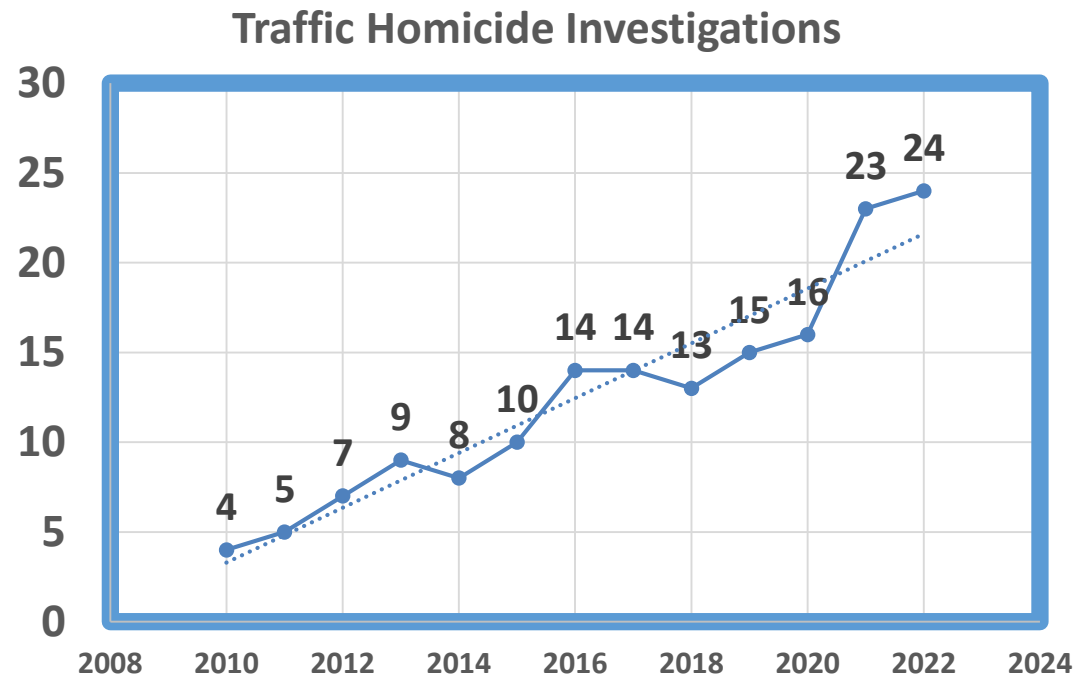
- DHETF members conducted a traffic stop. Identified members of a Felony Lane Gang.
  - Travel through US, conducting smash and grab conveyance burglaries to utilize credit cards.
  - \$34,464 located inside vehicle
  - 18 grams of marijuana, over 30 illegal prescription pills, 2 stolen driver's licenses, 1 stolen social security card, 7 stolen credit/debit cards, and 1 stolen bank check.
- A FedEx receipt was located for a package. Orlando Police Department intercepted the package which contained a large amount of stolen credit/debit cards, licenses, etc.



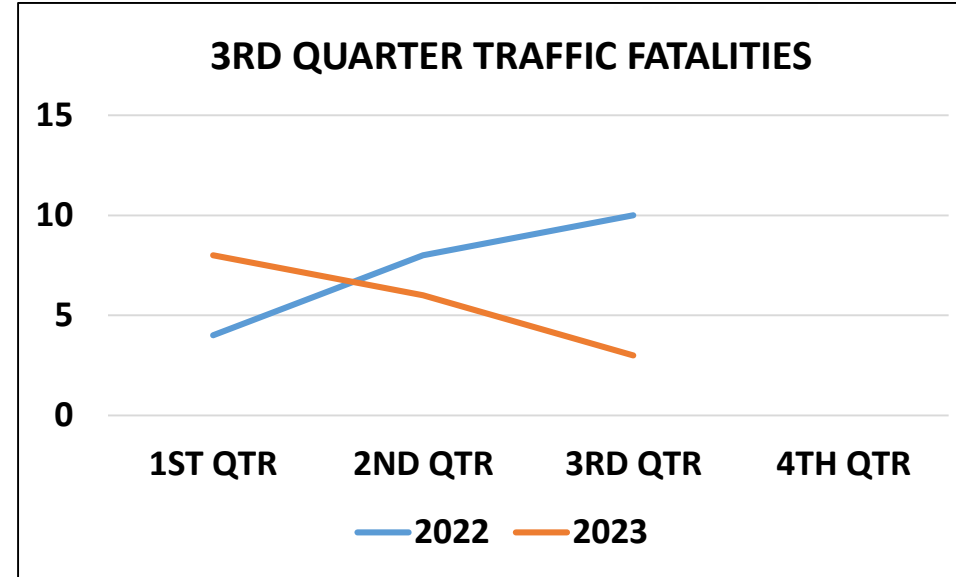
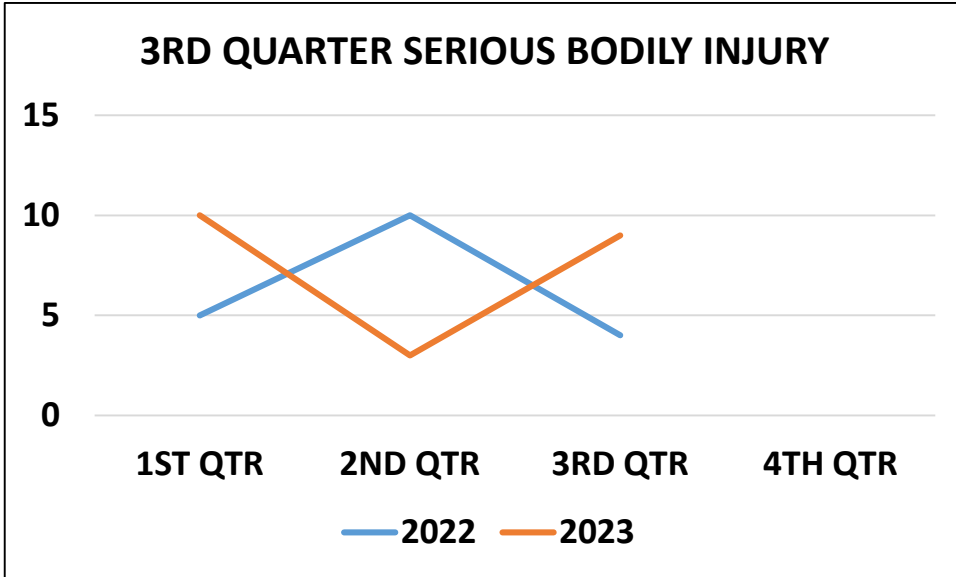

# 2023 Major Traffic Crashes 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter (FY 2023)



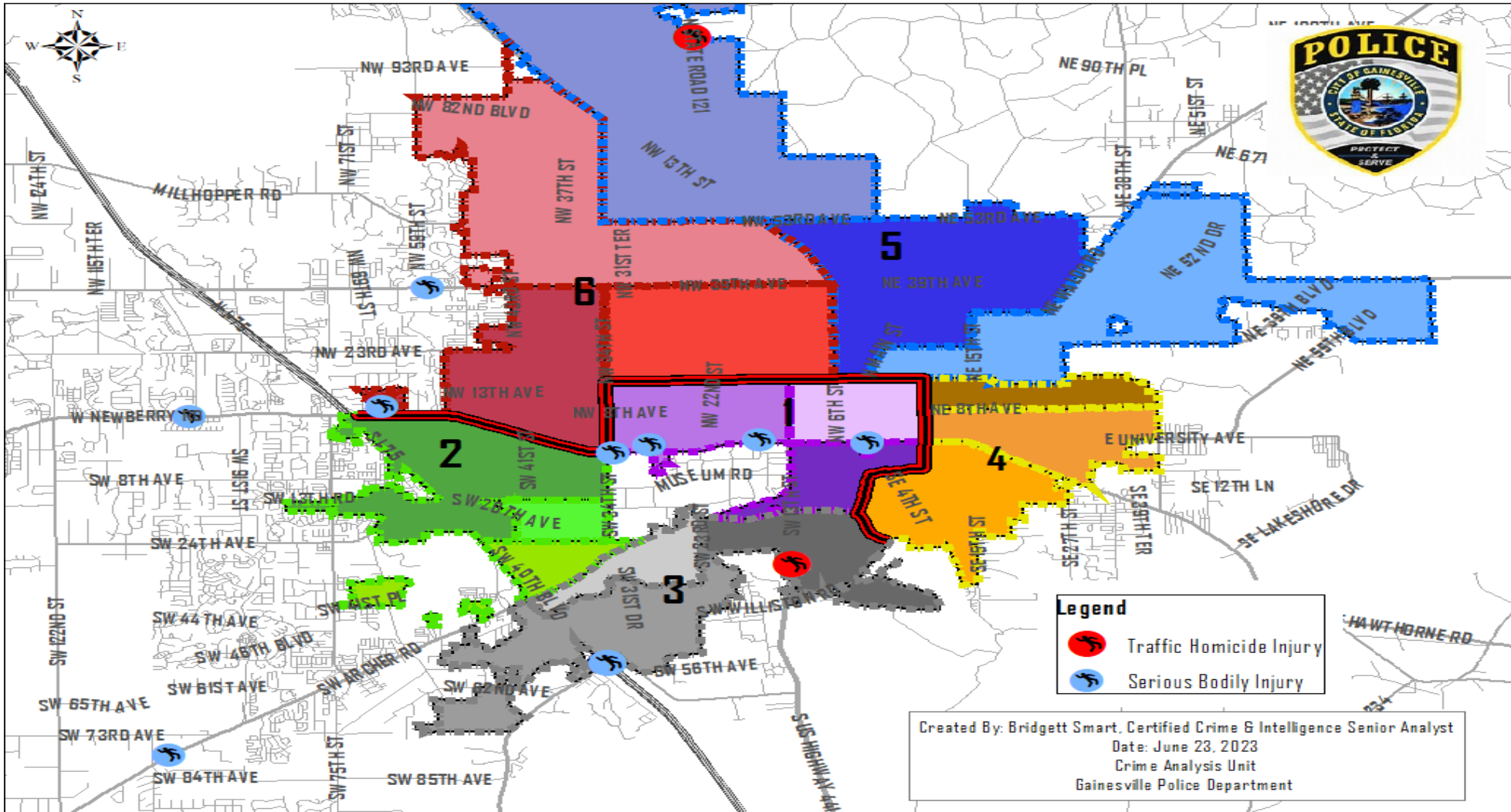
## Traffic Enforcement Detail

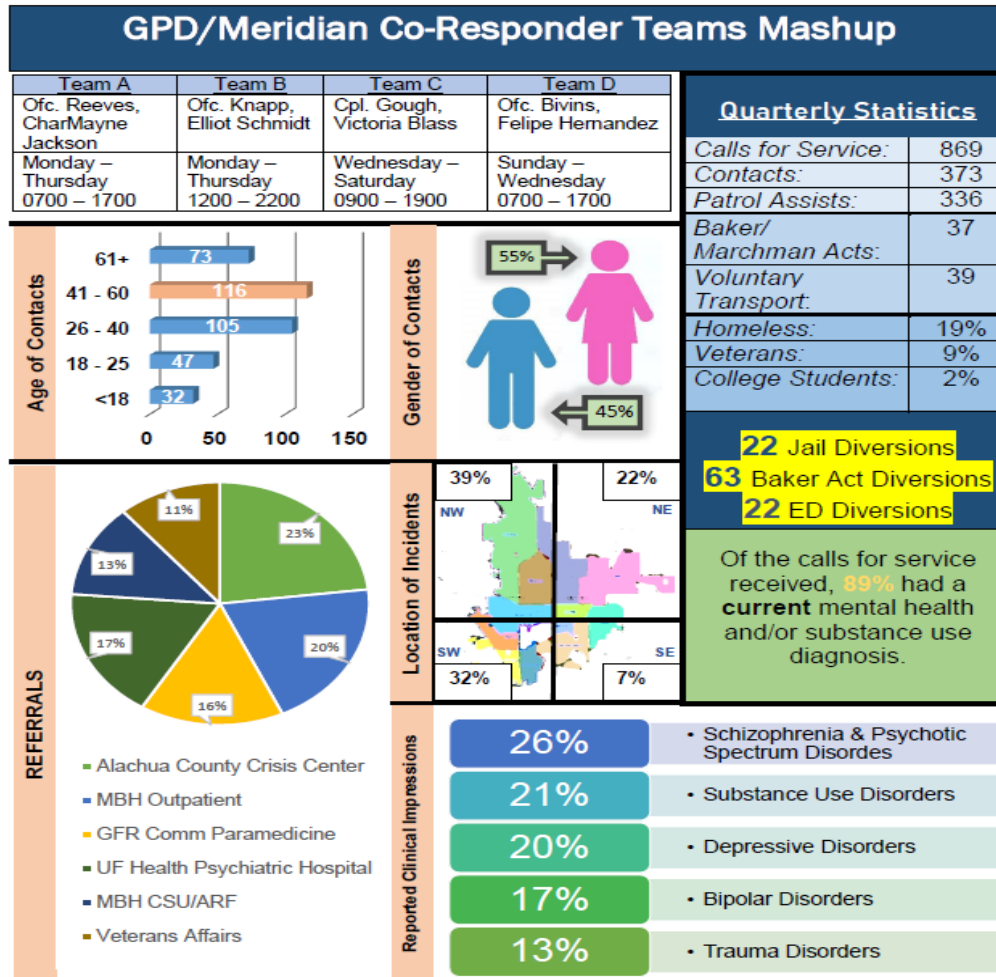
# 2023 Major Traffic Crashes 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter (FY 2023)

# Pastor's One Community Workgroup



## Individual Assistance Program

- Program Initiated March 20, 2023
- 2 individuals enrolled
  - One individual currently working with Pastor Duncan on painting job in housing complex gymnasium.
  - The other individual is working at Dunkin Donuts 13<sup>th</sup> Street.
- Working with Probation and Parole weekly contacts with officers through home visits and in-office reporting.
- Identifying ways for current alternative sentencing recommendations to the BOLD Program.

## BOLD Program

- BOLD Program currently has 64 people enrolled
- BOLD Program is a community assistance program which provides wrap around services for the community.

## Gun Violence Deterrence

- Meeting with Pastors and community members in Duval Community to support gun violence awareness.
- Planning three community events during the summer to bring awareness to gun violence.
- Next workgroup will be scheduled in July



# Personnel



**Career Fair:** June 23 - Kissimmee, FL.

- (1000 Registered and only 81 showed up.
  - 12 stopped by the table, no applications due to lack of wanting to relocate

**Local Police Academy Visits:**

- SFC Institute of Public Safety – 4 recruits job offered from the last 2 classes
- Citrus County Police Academy – 2 recruits hired

**GHFC Tabling:**

- Table set up in the lobby, for recruiting Officers- on-going

**SFC Women Athletes:**

- Continuing to meet with athletes regularly

**Non- Sworn Opportunities:**

- We have a high turn over rate for our Service Technicians. We have submitted a job audit request to class and compensation.

**Comparable Agency Information:**

- GPD has an approx. rate of vacancy of 17%
- ACSO has an approx. rate of vacancy of 16.25%
- Ocala has an approx. rate of vacancy of 8.25%
- University of FL PD has an approx. rate of vacancy of 10%.

\*\*\*\*GPD certified officer (no college degree) starts at \$48,568. Two year degree raises that to \$50,294. Of the 10 agencies surveyed only 2 others are lower than that. State Law Enforcement now starts at \$55K.

**GPD Award Recipients:**

**Detective Lindsay Allen:** Investigation led to criminal charges and arrest of suspect for sexual battery case on children under the age of 12 in Gainesville, New Mexico, Texas, and Pennsylvania.

**Officer Erin Armstrong:** Suspect shooting case where armed suspect fled. Ofc. Armstrong gave chase and tackled him while suspect was still armed. She was able to unarm the suspect before suspect fled again. Ofc. Armstrong gave vital information to other officers and K9 unit who took the suspect into custody without further incident.

**Detective Desiree Russano:** Sexual assault case of numerous minors at a daycare by a daycare workers.

- Detectives' Case of the Year and Detective Russano recognized as GPD's Detective of the Year.

**Officer Amanda Figueredo:** On patrol over the last year, from drug possession and distribution arrests, burglaries to a high number of dangerous firearms arrests.

- Recognized as GPD's Officer of the Year.



# Civilian Employee of the Quarter

## Hannah Smith- Special Events Coordinator



- Currently GPD's Special Events Coordinator and the City of Gainesville's Special events coordinator (encompasses two full-time positions)
- All special event applications submitted to the City, regardless if GPD is involved in the event, are processed by Ms. Smith.
- When a special events permit application is submitted, Hannah has to coordinate with all the other City departments to approve or deny the application.
- The other City entities involved include GFR, Public Works & Cultural Affairs, Public Works, Sustainable Development, RTS, Parking, Traffic Engineering, Code Enforcement, Fire Inspection, etc.
- She has far exceeded our expectations in her position and is a very valued member of our team, the Gainesville Police Department
- These awards are determined by all the employees at GPD through a survey process. Ms. Smith's peers voted for her to receive this award.
