Project Understanding and Approach

UNDERSTANDING

The City of Gainesville is requesting a Statement of Qualifications for Continuing Construction Management Professional Services for Minor Projects with a construction budget of less than \$4,000,000. As with any project, maintaining budgets while staying on schedule will be of paramount importance. Exceptions to the RFP

The only possible exception Parrish McCall takes to this RFP is Section 4.1 - Evaluation Criteria - Paragraph 4.5, regarding Article XI, Chapter 2 of the City's Code of Ordinances for Work Orders in excess of \$300,000 for construction. The referenced chapter requires that 10% of total labor hours on the project be logged by apprentices, and an additional 10% by disadvantaged workers.

We fully support the spirit of the requirement, but it is new to us, and we are uncertain of the impact this ordinance may have on project cost or administrative man-hours to comply and document compliance, or even the requirement's achievability.

Nonetheless, we will make every reasonable effort to comply.
