Born in 1918, being black in a racially separated culture was a very difficult obstacle to overcome during the Jim Crow Era. She had the distinct honor of being a student during the years the institution's legendary founder, Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune was there. Magnolia B. Jackson graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in elementary education.

In 2022, Bethune Cookman University confirmed Magnolia Bradley Jackson as the current oldest living Alumni in the country. Magnolia spends her "golden" years traveling, reading the bible, watching football, Family Feud, Judge Judy, and the local news. She attributes her longevity to "minding her own business" and "putting God first".
