*Key info: Felony Battery is any case headed "battery" (both domestic and non-) where the listed criminal charge had a felony level. Shots fired calls include all "shots fired/heard" calls and all "armed disturbances" that rose to the level of meriting a written report. Shootings are \*headed\* as "person shot" in the reporting system and therefore do not include homicides by gunfire, which are counted separately and headed as homicides or attempted homicides. In every case what is counted is the number of incidents, not the number of victims.*

*These definitions also apply to the statistics on the 4th-quarter stats slide that follows.*

Key info - Re: Stolen Firearms, the vehicle burglary number refers to the number of burglary incidents in which guns were taken, not the number of guns stolen via vehicle burglary.

Re: Shots Fired - includes calls headed as "shots fired/heard" and "armed disturbances" that rose to the level of needing a written report.

Re: Persons Shot - "not determined to be criminal" can either be accidental or insufficient cooperation from involved parties to definitively identify what happened.

Re: Suicides - Deaths are death investigations until after an ME rules them otherwise, which can take considerable time re lab testing etc. This number therefore can be subject to change well after the fact.

This info also applies to the 3Q23/4Q23 slide.
