

RESOLUTION NO. 2024-550

A resolution of the City Commission of the City of Gainesville, Florida; relating to the levy of general municipal purpose Ad Valorem Taxes for the 2024-2025 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2024 and ending September 30, 2025; establishing a proposed Millage Rate; computing the rolled back rate; setting a public hearing; providing for notice to the Alachua County Property Appraiser; and providing an immediate effective date.

WHEREAS, the Alachua County Property Appraiser certified the 2024 taxable values to the City Commission of the City of Gainesville, Florida on June 28, 2024.

WHEREAS, the gross taxable value for operating purposes not exempt from taxation within Alachua County has been certified by the County Property Appraiser to the City of Gainesville as \$11,025,579,892.

WHEREAS, Section 200.065, Florida Statutes, requires the City Commission to advise the Property Appraiser of its rolled-back millage rate, its proposed millage rate, and of the time, date, and place at which a public hearing will be held to consider the proposed millage rate and the proposed tentative budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:

Section 1. The proposed millage rate necessary to fund the proposed tentative general purpose municipal budget for the City of Gainesville’s 2024-2025 fiscal year is 6.4297.

Section 2. The FY 2024-2025 proposed operating millage rate is 6.4297 mills, which is greater than the rolled-back rate of 6.0444 mills by 6.37%.

1           **Section 3.** A public hearing will be held to consider the proposed millage rate and the  
2 tentative budget for general municipal purposes on Thursday, September 12, 2024, at 5:30 p.m.,  
3 or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard, in the City Hall Auditorium on the first floor of  
4 City Hall, 200 East University Avenue, City of Gainesville, Florida.

5           **Section 4.** The City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to provide a copy of this  
6 resolution to the Alachua County Property Appraiser for use in preparing the Notice of Proposed  
7 Property Taxes, as required by Section 200.069, Florida Statutes, and to execute, as the  
8 Administering Official, any Department of Revenue forms necessary to complete this certification.

9           **Section 4.** This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
