About the One Mill

- First approved by Alachua County voters in 2008 and renewed every four years since then
- Up for renewal this fall

Because it's a renewal, it does not increase taxes

Did you know?

The owner of a home in Alachua County valued at \$125K in 1998 is paying \$5 LESS in annual school taxes than they were then, despite the fact that the taxable value of their home has increased by more than \$88K!



One Mill in the schools

During the last school year, the One Mill provided more than \$8.7 million in funding for the 16 traditional public schools within Gainesville city limits; \$21 million districtwide

One Mill in the schools

The One Mill is currently fully or partly funding the salaries of 159 teachers in schools within the Gainesville city limits; 350 district-wide
